Thanks go out to **Bob Casey** & his granddaughter **Kaitlyn**, **Charlie LaPrease**, **John Miencarski**, **Amy North**, **Doug North**, **Jerry Sweeney**, and **Sue Vanderveer** for their help with our sale. Members of the Scrolling Interest Group will meet on Wednesday, January 20th or its first meeting of 2016. Based on discussion at the November meeting, we will use the January meeting to discuss the tools needed to create a scrollsawn bowl, including the angle guide and the bowl press. The challenge? Bring at least one scrolled piece completed since the November meeting. ✂

SOME THOUGHTS ON ORNAMENTS ...

When ornaments are sold, often they are hung on metal racks, 2-4 per hook, using purchased ornament hangers so the clients can remove an individual ornament without removing the rest. Therefore, we need a way to hang ornaments that are donated. We appreciate your efforts to put fishing line, ribbons, and other hooks onto the ornaments but we'd rather you not as they make it difficult when packing and unpacking as well as, oddly enough, hanging the ornaments. Also, please make sure that each ornament has a drilled or cut hole for the hook that is at least 1/16". The hole can be larger.

If you are adding screw eyes to the top of an ornament, please do not use super small eyes as we can't get a commercial ornament hook thru the really small eyes. JewelrySupply.com sells screw eyes that work or buy on Amazon.com. If you are creating your own, please test to make sure you can get a commercial ornament hook thru the eye.

Ornament Topics - We receive inquiries at every show for ornaments of various topics; each show produces different requests. At the St. Rose sale, we had a particularly odd request – *vegetables*. We also need ornaments depicting *each of the military branches*. Here are some tips

Birds – most including eagle **Animals** – most – hedgehog, koala bear, elephant, penguins, moose, etc

General – service groups like firemen, policemen; the military emblems; male/female at computer; male/female working a computer game console; sleds

Sports – male & female participating in all sports, e.g. baseball/softball, basketball, bowling, cheerleading, cycling, dance, field hockey, fishing, football, golf, gymnastics, hockey, lacrosse, rowing, running, skiing, snowboarding, soccer, tennis, volleyball, wrestling, etc.

Religious – crosses of all sizes, angels, general religious ornaments; individual 12 days of Christmas, esp. partridge in pear tree; nativity scenes & sets

Other than Ornaments – We are always looking for a variety of pieces to sell. They do not have to be ornaments. Magnets, bottle stoppers, clocks, seam rippers, letter openers, bottle openers, light pulls, keychains, candlesticks, etc. are always welcome in addition to unique ornaments.

Plane Making Class participants can make a Molding Plane, Shoulder Plane, Scrub Plane, or – new this year – a Compass Plane. **John Wilson** travels from Michigan to teach the class.



SHOP TIME: Get Organized in 2016!

You've got some great storage in your shop but you can't find a thing. Why? The storage you've added is missing organization. If you have drawers, think about using these ideas to organize your tools and supplies!



Divide each deep drawer into two layers. For the bottom layer, make a divided box. When you measure for the box, leave a 1/16" gap between the box and the drawer should you ever have a need to remove the box. The dividers are dadoed into the sides of the insert box. They also accept subdividers, so you can customize the box for whatever you need to store.

To take advantage of the space above the box, made some totes to rest on top. Each tote has a pair of fixed dividers and a handle. Besides making it easy to organize small items, you can remove a tote from the drawer and take it right where it's needed.
